- 1. **Pos Business:** Nigerians are fast embracing the use of Point of Sale Machine for their transactions. Be it cash withdrawal, fund transfer, account opening and utility bill payment, these are easily executed through POS. Youth can easily start this business as start-up capital is low and it promises a good returns especially when the vendor is in a good location. You can also do this business in someone's shop base on agreement.
- Food Commodity Business: One of the fastest growing businesses is Agribusiness. Agribusiness is an industry concerned with the production and sale of farm products. Do you know why? Irrespective of how costly things are, households still need foods to survive. Youth should explore opportunities in commodity business—yam tubers, Garri, Rice, Beans, Condiments etc.
- Start Food Business: Everyone must eat to survive. Youth can start a food business. If one does not have money to rent a store, he or she can sell by roadside. The main

- point is let your food be delicious. You will go home each day with good returns.
- 4. Home Lessons: Some parents need tutors for their children especially in subjects they find hard to learn in school. Can you provide them this service? If you can, you will make good money on weekly or Monthly basis.
- 5. Write and Sell E-Book: Youth with knowledge and experience in a particular area can put down their knowledge in a book and sell.
- 6. Home Cleaning Services: There are people that are looking for those that will sweep and keep their home and compound clean. Youth can explore this opportunity. There are tenants that pay cleaners up to #10,000 a Month to sweep their yard 2 or 3 times in a week. Imagine if you have 10 or more places you render that services, that is #100,000 or more in a Month.
- 7. Sell Your Knowledge Online: There are people who need what you know now and are ready to pay for it. This is an avenue to earn. Can you create an online course? Can you hold a seminar online through zoom, You Tube or Whatsaap? If you are good at what you do, people will participate in your seminar. You can teach skills, Mathematics, English Language and people will pay to participate.
- 8. Sales Agent: This can be offline or online. Get people that need a particular product. Get orders and money from them. Purchase those products and deliver to them and earn your commission. This is an easy business to start without money. For example, there are lots of shops that need POS Machine now. You can go around and get orders from them and meet dealers, to supply POS to them, and they will pay you your commission. Likewise, you can get orders from households that need some commodities like yam. Add a commission on each tuber. Tell the price you are willing to sell, get their orders. Meet the vendor or producers. Buy at cheaper rate and deliver households.
- Graphic Designing: This is a skill that is in hot demand at present! Carve a niche in graphic designing. There are even free Apps to download and start making graphics for people. APP like Canva. You can invest small money and master the act

- of creating graphics. You can make money in two ways from this skill- creating designs and by teaching others how to create graphics.
- 10. Teach Digital Skills: The world is going digital and very many people are coming online. Position yourself in the digital economy. Learn high paying skills and teach it to others. Skills like Email Marketing, Facebook Ads, Whatsaap Marketing, SEO, Copywriting, etc
- 11. Affiliate Marketing: Can you help others to sell their goods and services? That is what affiliate marketing is all about. You can be affiliate to over ten vendors. Any of their products you sell, you make commission. All you need to ask vendors especially online ones is whether they run affiliate programme. Often you will see a menu saying," Become our affiliate. Go in and check the requirements and commission.
- 12. Learn the Practical Aspect of Any Course You are Studying in the University While Still in School: Generally speaking, learn skills irrespective of the course you study in the university. Many big organizations are interested in what you are capable of doing. A good certificate blended with practical experience yields more positive results.
- 13. Seek Scholarship Opportunities within Outside the Country: Nelson Mandela says" Education is the powerful weapon which you can use to change the world. Do not think that scholarship is not possible! It is very possible! My bosom friends: Prof. Rita Oluchi Orji and Dr Jide Nwajiobi went to Canada and United States of America on scholarships. Go to the internet and search for schools that give scholarship opportunities. limiting yourself! You can do all things you through God who strengthens (Phil.4:13). You are limitless by God's grace!
- 14. Get a Good Mentor: No man is a compendium of knowledge. You need someone to help you climb the ladder of success. You need people to succeed in this life. We all have our diverse gifts; you can tap from your mentor. Typical examples, Jesus and His disciples (Jesus opened the eyes of His disciples by teaching them the nitty-gritty of Christian

- faith in Mathew Chapter 5); Elisha was mentored by Elijah.
- 15. Adopt a New Strategy: Everything is about strategy. The word' strategy 'depicts the means of achieving something. But in a perspective, management it is integrated plan through which organization accomplishes its objectives. Learn to strategize! Be very creative and innovative! Come up with novel ideas on daily basis. That is one of the secrets of success in this age of technology.
